Congratulations on purchasing an HP 9000 Model 217 computer. We know you're going to enjoy using it. The instructions which follow will help you unpack the computer and inventory the contents, then point the way to install the system.

Taking Inventory


Your Model 217 computer comes packed in either one or four boxes depending on which option you bought. You may also receive other boxes containing peripherals depending on what configuration you ordered.

If you purchased product number 9817A, you received one box:

• The computer/accessories kit box


If you purchased product number 9817H, you received four boxes:

9817H Packaging



Note

Remember which option you have, 9817A or 9817H. You'll need to know this when you begin setting up. You have a 9817A if you received one box and a 9817H if you received four. In addition, the 9817H has a 98204B Composite Video card installed in an accessory slot.

Let's open up each box:

The Computer/Accessories Kit Box


This box is labelled 9817 and 98280. It contains two boxes, the accessories kit box and the box containing the computer, in which you found this Unpacking Instruction.

Carefully remove the computer. Place it on a desk or other level surface. Don't try to plug it in or turn it on yet. Instructions for this step are provided in the *Model 217 Installation Guide*. If you have a 9817H, also remove the video cable from the box.

Now go on to the accessories kit box. It is labelled 98280. In it you should find these items:

Note that you received a keyboard cable even if you did not order a keyboard. It is included in case you obtain a keyboard in the future.



NOTE: Plugs are viewed from connector end. Shape of molded plug may vary within country.

Power cords supplied by HP have polarities matched to the power-input socket on the computer:

- L = Line or Active Conductor (also called "live" or "hot")
- N = Neutral or Identified Conductor
- E = Earth or Safety Ground
